Many model aircraft feature flaps and attract scale enthusiasts because they add to realism and benefit flight characteristics. Whether they are plain, split, slotted or Fowler, there are a couple things to bear in mind when you deploy these "air brakes".

- Pitch change: When flaps are engaged, an airplane will typically change its pitch attitude due to the wings' lift changing. Obviously, we do not want the model to do something "interesting" so generally some down-elevator will be needed to level out the plane and keep it from climbing. A good computer radio allows you to dial in a mix for an appropriate elevator setting to compensate for the changes and will keep the nose from ballooning.
- Speed: We know that an airplane will slow in the air with flaps extended so be ready to add power if necessary. I always switch the flaps for testing a couple of mistakes high prior to making an attempt near terra firma. This allows you to get a feel of what your aircraft will do when you make a "change" to the wings which involves a considerable drag "addition".

Try your flap settings up high and adjust their throw(s) as needed to make your model respond the way you prefer. You should find that your airplane can operate from a smaller/shorter area and will not need to be flown in like a missile.
