### Covering with Iron-on Film

Iron-on plastic film is the covering of choice for most RC pilots. Just a few years ago, the only choices were Top Flite MonoKote and Hangar 9 UltraCote. Those "heavy" plastic coverings are still the preferred materials for glow and gas planes today. There are now a number of lighter covering materials available that are used primarily on park flyers and electrics. When applying any covering material, a primary concern is 1) the temperature at which the adhesive melts (bonding temperature) and 2) the temperature for maximum shrinkage (shrinking temperature). These temps vary considerable on the lighter materials with some significantly lower than MonoKote and UltraCote. Remove the protective backing. Read and follow the directions for your product. All listed temperatures are approximate and you must test with scrap materials using your iron or your gun to find the temp that works best for you. Jay will demonstrate covering techniques at the next SIRS meeting on January 14.
